October Tip of the Month: Night Lighting

Outdoor lighting at night can prevent others' enjoyment of the natural environment, decrease mating activities of night insects, interfere with migratory, mating and hunting patterns of many species, and decrease insect populations which impacts food chains and pollination.

To mitigate the effects of lights at night, **install motion sensors**, use cool lights of color temperature 3000k or below, and shield fixtures so light shines down, not up or out.
