One year ago this month, Pinewood experienced extremely low temperatures without much snow cover. This resulted in frozen service lines, frozen meters and even a couple of frozen main lines. We strongly suggest that if you are away from home for any length of time, please turn the water off either by shutting off the whole house valve or have us turn the water off at the meter pit or both. Last month, a resident's plumbing froze, causing a leak that used 33,200 gallons. The water in Pinewood is too precious to allow that to happen.
