A friendly reminder that your dogs must be on leash or under voice control at *all* times. There was a tragic incident recently where a loose dog attacked a woman walking her dog on leash. The woman was shaken up but not physically

injured. Sadly, her little dog did not survive. **Please be a good neighbor and keep your dog confined in your yard or leashed!** This incident occurred in the vicinity of Kiowa and upper Wichita. This is at least the 6th such incident over the past years (not with the same dog). We all need to be aware that when we are out walking and hiking in Pinewood, that we are vulnerable to attack whether it be from a dog at large, a lion, a bear, or even a doe defending her new fawn. Carry protection with you whether it be a stick, wasp spray that can drop something as large as a bear when aimed at the face, pepper spray, ammonia, or an air horn. Be ready to defend yourself and your pets!
